Dr. Mott has two primary areas of research: the pharmacy labor market and pharmacist service development and impacts. His research of the pharmacist labor market has investigated trends in the supply and demand of pharmacists, factors associated with the number of hours worked by pharmacists, and trends in turnover rates, and reasons pharmacists leave jobs. In 2000, 2004, 2009, and 2013 he worked on the National Pharmacist Workforce Survey. His research looking at pharmacist service development and impacts focuses on the pharmacist's role in preventing falls among older adults. Currently he is studying trends in pharmacist demand in Wisconsin pharmacies, benchmarking the capacity of the pharmacist workforce, and the role of pharmacists in preventing falls among older adults in rural areas of Wisconsin.
