Ms. Libby J. Ross is the senior director for student affairs at the American Association of Colleges of Pharmacy (AACP) and an association executive with expertise in enrollment management in health professions education. She began her career as an international admissions officer at Shenandoah University before joining the Association of American Veterinary Medical Colleges (AAVMC) as an academic program specialist and then associate director of the Veterinary Medical College Application Service (VMCAS).

Subsequently, at the American Association of Colleges of Pharmacy (AACP), she served as the director of student affairs and founded the Pharmacy College Application Service (PharmCAS). She joined the American Physical Therapy Association (APTA) as the founding director of the Physical Therapist Centralized Application Service (PTCAS) and later as the program director of the Education Leadership Institute (ELI) Fellowship.

Ms. Ross returned to AACP in her current role as senior director and oversees the Association's portfolio of application services and student affairs programs, including the Pharmacy Is Right for Me (Pharm4Me) student recruitment campaign. She has co-authored multiple publications and received the Stanford Award for Most Influential Publication in 2018 from the Journal of Physical Therapy Education (JOPTE). Ms. Ross earned a bachelor's degree with departmental honors at the University of Mary Washington and a master's degree in international commerce and policy at the George Mason University School of Public Policy.
